Fall Driving Tips

Watch for children: Children often like to play in piles of leaves. They don't understand the danger of playing in leaves left on the roadside.


Watch where you're stepping: With leaves on the ground and everywhere, uneven payment and holes may be covered leading to a slip and fall hazard.

Be prepared for ice: As temperatures drop further at night, frosted windshields in the morning become a reality. Allow for extra time to clear the ice. In addition, black ice may develop in shaded areas, on road debris and frost may create slick roadways early in the morning.

Be prepared for bright sunlight: Shorter days also subject motorists to sun glare may be so bright that it makes driving tough. You need to understand this poses challenges to lesser trained drivers who may be already distracted. Sunglasses help.

Animals: Autumn marks the beginning of deer breeding season and they will be more active during sunset and sunrise so be extra watchful when driving near the woods. Watch your speed and do not swerve to miss hitting an animal. By doing this, you can put yourself in a position that could harm yourself and others.
